

## Regathering Information and Instructions

### Registration:

- Until physical distancing restrictions are lifted, we have limited seating available in the auditorium. That said, each week, we will ask everyone to register for the worship service so we can plan and assign seats.
- Please be aware that due to seating capacity, you may be asked to view the service via the live stream in an overflow seating room.

### What to know before you get to church:

- Each person has a responsibility to look out for the welfare of others. Therefore, if you are feeling sick in any way, please stay home. [According to the CDC](#), symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms or combinations of symptoms may have COVID-19: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea. Please closely evaluate the state of your own health before arriving to the church building.
- We understand that the decision of when and how you re-enter society is a personal one, and we understand if you don't feel ready to return to church just yet.
- We don't have bulletins available on Sunday mornings, but sermon notes and Bethel Kids Listening Guides will be available on your way into the auditorium (you can also access/print these resources on our [website](#)). Please bring writing utensils, as well as any other materials that will be helpful, with you on Sundays, and please be sure to take them with you when you leave.

### Face Coverings and Physical Distancing

- [Face coverings](#) are required to enter the building and at all times inside for everyone aged Kindergarten and up. Any child who has not reached Kindergarten is not required to wear a face covering.
- Please maintain physical distance of six feet from those outside of your household while on the church property.

### Logistics:

- Please arrive no later than 10:15 a.m. to allow time for any queue and orderly seating.
- Everyone will enter the building through the long awning door. Before doing so, please stop at one of the markings on the sidewalk in order to allow for six feet of physical distance between households. A greeter will be there to direct the queue, answer any questions, and give instructions about the building.
- Once inside the building, follow the arrows on the floor to the lobby.
- Please keep all belongings, such as jackets and umbrellas, with you.
- Prior to entering the auditorium, please stop at one of the markings on the floor in the hallway/lobby in order to allow for six feet of physical distance between households. An usher will be there to direct the queue and show you where you'll be sitting.
- If at all possible, please stay in your seats for the whole service.
- After the service, an usher will dismiss by rows.
- You will exit the auditorium through the front door by the organ and exit the building through the short awning door. Please be mindful to not block the exit as you leave.
- We will all likely want to catch up with people, but please wait until you're outside the building and continue to maintain six feet of physical distance from those outside of your household.

### Frequently Asked Questions

#### 1. Will our online live stream continue?

Yes, we will continue the live stream service at least until the time when we can all safely meet together.

**2. I'm in the vulnerable population category. May I attend these services?**

Yes! We do want to emphasize that the CDC [identifies](#) older adults, pregnant people, and people with certain medical conditions as being at an increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19. Therefore, if you choose to attend an in-person worship service, please follow the link above to make yourself aware of those who are at increased risk for severe illness due to COVID-19, learn more about reducing your risk of getting COVID-19, etc.

**3. Can I bring my children with me?**

Yes! Please keep in mind that children must remain with their parent/guardian at all times. Children are more than welcome to remain in the auditorium throughout the service, but during this season when we aren't offering childcare, we have three family rooms available for parents who may desire to step out of the service for a few moments to help a child who is having a hard time: the Infant Nursery (room 115), the Toddler Room (room 116), and the 4-K Classroom (room 114).

Parents, please be sure to continue following the face covering and distancing guidelines in these rooms, and please also sanitize any items your child uses with the provided disinfectant wipes before you leave the room. In order to allow for physical distancing, we'd ask there to be no more than two to three families per room at a given time. Also, there are limited toys/activities in the rooms, so if you anticipate using the rooms, it may be a good idea to bring an activity/toy from home.

**4. Which restrooms can I use?**

All restrooms will be open. There is a changing table in both the men's and the women's restroom in the middle of the building. Please be mindful to maintain physical distance of six feet even in the restrooms. Hand sanitizer will be stationed in the lobby and outside the restrooms in the middle of the building. Restrooms will be cleaned in regular weekly cleaning.

**5. When will we all be able to worship together?**

We are currently limited by the physical distance requirement of six feet and the restriction from the state that limits us to 30% of our fire occupancy. As those requirements are lifted/modified, we will be able to fit more and more people in the auditorium until we're all able to worship there together.

**6. What additional cleaning is happening in the church building?**

High contact surfaces, such as door handles and light switches, will be disinfected every two hours during events with an EPA-approved disinfectant, and the building will be cleaned throughout the week and sanitized every Monday.

**7. Will we be able to celebrate communion in person?**

Yes! We are currently celebrating communion together (in person and virtually) on the first Sunday of each month.

**8. If any contact tracing is necessary, who is the point of contact?**
